

# Norbury Junction Trail - Shropshire Union Canal

## The Trail

The [Norbury Junction Trail](#) starts outside the Wharf Cafe on Norbury Wharf and follows the towpath to the Shelmore Embankment. The trail takes approximately 30 minutes including stops.

## Answers

### Sheet 2 Answers

Stop 2: The long, single-storey building is now used as a cafe, shop and chandlery.

Norbury Bridge is Bridge 38 on the Shropshire Union Canal.

### Sheet 3 Answers

Stop 3: The roving bridge is Bridge 1 on the Newport Branch.

Stop 4: A variety of reclaimed materials has been used to construct the new Service Station and Information Point. These recycled materials include old bricks, window frames, chimney pots and roofing slates.

The canal is wider where the former Newport Branch joined the Shropshire Union Canal. This enabled boats leaving the Newport Branch to turn easily onto the main line. It also gave enough space for boats to moor alongside Norbury Wharf.

### Sheet 4 Answers
